There were reports of a roofing company soliciting in Lake Forest reported to Tom Duro. Soliciting is not permitted in the community at all. Tom contacted the company and advised them of our policy.

Treasurers Report- Bob Palmer

In Bob's absence Greg Stephenson read the following report from Bob:

As of May 31, 2018 we had \$293,297 in our checking accounts and \$338,122 in certificates of deposit.

Our loan balance was \$336,827.

Income for the year beginning February 1st was \$342,234 and expenses totaled \$79,748 resulting in net income of \$262,486. Net income will be dropping in the coming months due to the fact that much of

our assessments have been paid and we are getting into the most expensive time of the year.

Community Managers Report: Tom Duro

Water Usage – Well # 1 pumped 822,000 gallons and Well # 2 pumped 1,421,200 gallons for a

total of 2,243,200 gallons.

• Lagoon – The lagoon is running normal.

• Maintenance – Repaired water main leak at the Lake Ann Dam. Baumann's dug it out and Lake

Forest repaired a failed glue fitting. Took care of the issue behind Tim Uding's house with the water runoff. We will call it first attempt. Located water line for new home on Lakewood.

Lakes: Duane Harley

On May 16th the Department of Conservation was out to shock all three lakes to perform a species evaluation. This was performed at the request of the Lakes Committee to ensure that our current annual stocking program is appropriate and that we are stocking the proper species of fish for all to enjoy. A big thank you goes out to Jason Crites of the DOC and his partner who spent most of the day out here at Lake Forest. We have not yet received the formal report but I will share the summary results during the July meeting as I expect it any day.

We did discuss with Jason the recently reported mortality of some fish that were found down by the dam, but there was nothing conclusive identified. We will continue to monitor the situation. After speaking further with Jason, we believe that the rapid rise in temperature of the shallow water where fish typically spawn could have led to this brief mortality period.

A resident has approached the Lakes Committee regarding the beach. There has been a major uptick in beach utilization and possibly upgrading this area may be beneficial to the lake community. The Lakes Committee will go down and perform some clean-up activities but wanted to know if The Board would consider allocating some additional funds next year for some minor upgrades to improve this area.

The Second Annual Youth Fishing Day was held on June 2^{nd.} Rob Sulkowski (Our local Conservation Officer) kicked off this year's derby, followed by a brief "Safety Talk" by Bob Bach. Bob only had to deal with a little sand in the eye and issued only one band-aid for a scrape so all in all, a very safe event for the kids. This year we had 35 children participate. There were 95 fish safely caught and released along with one crawdad. Once again, John Summers did an outstanding job seeking and obtaining sponsors for this year's event. This event could not be as successful without John's dedication, leadership and follow-through. Thanks also goes out to Skip Swargulski for supporting John in this year's effort. All the fishing day sponsors are to receive an appreciation letter from the Lakes Committee along with

photographs for sharing with their internal organizations.

The slow no-wake buoys are reset in Party Cove and down by the marina. We set the solar lights to a

"constant on" position to eliminate any shadow flicker as reported by one of the landowners down by

the marina.

The preliminary measurement down at the marina indicates space for an additional (10) boat slips. The

Lakes Committee recommends that the current slip design depth increased to a 20' depth to allow for

the newly approved pontoon boat lengths. There is ample space for this slip depth increase. The Lakes

Committee plans to work with the Board to obtain quotes for this work for consideration for later this

year when Lake Ann is scheduled to be lowered.

Lastly, we have had some minor vandalism down at the boat ramp down by the dam as the security

cables were disassembled and thrown on the ground. The security cables have been repaired and put

back into service. Again, if you see something and if you do not report it to the Sheriff's office, nothing

will improve. Also, we have been retrieving floating beer bottles from the lake. These are "Our Precious

Resources" to enjoy.

Additional notice: Please follow the instructions for pesticides and lawn treatments while spraying close

to the lakes. Some are known to be the cause of fish kills and some are completely safe. Best to know

what you are working with.
